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GENERAL CATALOGUE

In this catalogue, tickets within each price band are sorted firstly into company (i.e., pre-grouping and pre-nationalisation), then British Railways regional order (i.e., Northern, Eastern, London Midland, Scottish, Southern and Western regions).

REVISED ORDERING GUIDELINES

Tickets from this catalogue will be processed on a '**First Come, First Served**' automatedbasis.

To give you the best chance of securing the tickets you want, use the online facility (using your email address and password), which many of you are now familiar with. Once an order has been submitted online, the system will inform you which tickets are available instantly. You can submit further orders from the same catalogue, which gives you the flexibility of ordering second choice tickets. Orders will be processed within three working days. Payment processes can be via: PayPal; Credit/Debit Cards (WorldPay Pay by Link); bank transfer or cheque.

We will continue to process orders received via email/telephone/post as soon as possible.

All tickets offered in this catalogue are in at least "very good" condition, i.e. not damaged or mounted, unless otherwise stated in the legend (see below).

LEGEND

- **A:** indicates that the ticket is unissued and has originated from an Audit Office
- **C**: indicates that the ticket is creased
- $\ensuremath{\textbf{F}}$: indicates that the ticket is faded
- G: indicates that the ticket is grubby or soiled
- M: indicates that the ticket has been mounted

Back to the modern collection and a visit to an LNER travel agancy, A.486 and to a first class blank to blank issued on 20-07-1972 with a serial of 0116, wonder how long this issue lasted before being withdrawn. The journey in manuscript of course is from **GLASGOW CENTRAL** to London (Kings Cross) via Carstairs, Edinburgh & RWCK. The date stamp used was an old fashioned one even then. It is not known where this agency was located, can anyone assist? Now to something completely different and a dated 15-11-1971 'free' platform ticket coloured blue from **BOSTON**. These tickets are seen occasionally however it is unusual to see a dated example, The ticket was dated using an LNER dating press as well. These issues had been well used in the past as our example is series 6. It could have been used to allow access by workers bringing in supplies for the station bookstall, for example. Does anyone know exactly? We now move onto another example of an LNER 'free' platform ticket, this time from **RET-FORD** which is dated 27-07-1976. Again this issue is common undated. The serial is 1085. Again, not sure of the exact purpose of this type of ticket here? One more 'free' issue for you and that is the one from **MALTON** which is dated 11-07-1974 and is quite faded. The serial is 0332 and the title is 'Platform. Admit One (Free)' No doubt at this time these issues were handed out to collectors' which no doubt pleased the recipients. We now move to our Southern Railway issues of which we have quite a selection, so far. Next time we start with a single from **ABBEY WOOD**.














