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THEME CATALOGUE

In this catalogue, tickets within each price band are sorted firstly into company (i.e., pre-grouping and pre-nationalisation), then British Railways regional order (i.e., Northern, Eastern, London Midland, Scottish, Southern and Western regions).

REVISED ORDERING GUIDELINES

Tickets from this catalogue will be processed on a 'First Come, First Served' automated-basis.

To give you the best chance of securing the tickets you want, use the online facility (using your email address and password), which many of you are now familiar with. Once an order has been submitted online, the system will inform you which tickets are available instantly. You can submit further orders from the same catalogue, which gives you the flexibility of ordering second choice tickets. Orders will be processed within three working days. Payment processes can be via: PayPal; Credit/Debit Cards (WorldPay Pay by Link); bank transfer or cheque.

We will continue to process orders received via email/telephone/post as soon as possible.

All tickets offered in this catalogue are in at least "very good" condition, i.e. not damaged or mounted, unless otherwise stated in the legend (see below).

LEGEND

A: indicates that the ticket is unissued and has originated from an Audit Office

C: indicates that the ticket is creased

F: indicates that the ticket is faded

G: indicates that the ticket is grubby or soiled


M: indicates that the ticket has been mounted

Continuing with our 1970's Southern Railway issues we move onto ASH, for which a first class privilege single to Aldershot is held, this was validated by an NCR21 on 18-06-1986 with a serial of 0037. I was half aware that this issue was still around but never visited myself. Onto quite an interesting issue now from BELTRING & BAIN-BRIDGES HALT to Maidstone West which is a normal public child third class single. It was issued on 15-05-1974 from an NCR21 and the fare was 11p with quite a high serial of 1563. This station was destaffed in the early 1980's I think. Still with 1974 we hold a 'government rate' first class sinlge from BROCKENHURST to East Grinstead which is in manuscript. There is a high serial of 2296 and the fare is 0.00, the fare being paid for by the Ministry of Defence. There was clearly a demand for this facility, although I am not aware of any defence establishment nearby, unless it had something to do with 'Wellworthy', a local firm who had their own station once, which was called Ampress Halt, perhaps a local reader could enlighten us further. Over to Kent next and a public fare two coupon monthly return from CANTERBURY WEST to Deal. One could return from Deal on either the train or the East Kent Road Car Co.Ltd. Omnibus. It was issued on 13-09-1971 with a fare of 76p and has a serial of 0820. I suspect that this was issued for a collector as it has one tidy clip on the outward portion. Next to West Sussex and a two coupon privilege return from CHICHESTER to Nutbourne Halt. It is NCR21 dated 05-03-1973, the fare was 4p and the serial is 0492 near the end.











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
