THEME CATALOGUE

In this catalogue, tickets within each price band are sorted firstly into company (i.e., pre-grouping and pre-nationalisation), then British Railways regional order (i.e., Northern, Eastern, London Midland, Scottish, Southern and Western regions).

REVISED ORDERING GUIDELINES

Tickets from this catalogue will be processed on a 'First Come, First Served' automated-basis.

To give you the best chance of securing the tickets you want, use the online facility (using your email address and password), which many of you are now familiar with. Once an order has been submitted online, the system will inform you which tickets are available instantly. You can submit further orders from the same catalogue, which gives you the flexibility of ordering second choice tickets. Orders will be processed within three working days. Payment processes can be via: PayPal; Credit/Debit Cards (WorldPay Pay by Link); bank transfer or cheque.

We will continue to process orders received via email/telephone/post as soon as possible.

All tickets offered in this catalogue are in at least "very good" condition, i.e. not damaged or mounted, unless otherwise stated in the legend (see below).

LEGEND

A: indicates that the ticket is unissued and has originated from an Audit Office

C: indicates that the ticket is creased

F: indicates that the ticket is faded

G: indicates that the ticket is grubby or soiled

M: indicates that the ticket has been mounted


Modern Edmondsons: We return to the Western region to describe a new addition to the collection. This is a pink two coupon Special Day return from **CHARLBURY** to Worcester (BR) issued on 05-04-1986 with a serial of 0064. Charlbury had slipped through the net, as all we seemed to come across were day returns to Oxford or London and I had not bothered to put one in the collection. Also Worcester (BR) is interesting as a destination.

Continuing with our issued post 1970 pre-nat. collection we move onto HULL and a 25-01-1970 Furlough single to Nottingham Victoria which had actually closed by 1967, the serial is a high 5577. There are other issues around from Hull issued after this time. Now to Essex and a first class single issued on 27-02-1970 from KIRBY CROSS to Frinton-on-Sea in manuscript, this was about to be issued out as the serial is 0996. I think that Almex tickets were used here afterwards, but perhaps season tickets were still issued. A long journey now to Fife and a 12-02-1973 two coupon First class day return from LEUCHARS JUN to Cupar in manuscript with a serial of 0476 and a manuscript fare of 0.23. Pretty sure that this would have been purchased for a collection as it would have been and still is the cheapest first class return fare from here. Now to a child priv. (with red overprints 'P' 'CHILD') from FENCHURCH ST. to Southend-on-Sea (LMS) issued on 14-12-1975 with a serial of 0820 and is faded.


